Message from the Mayor:

Hello neighbors: The City has had a busy year so far, and we have some fun and exciting events planned for this summer. But first, if you haven't checked out the City's newly designed website, I invite you to view it at www.dupontwa.gov. The website features a fresh look, user-friendly navigation, and informative content to help residents and visitors understand our services.

The City also launched a new service request and resident reporting software. The "SeeClickFix" app allows DuPont residents who identify community repair or service request needs to submit photos, location information, and request details directly to City administrative staff members. In addition, the platform provides City officials with a centralized system to manage issues from creation to resolution — engaging residents throughout the process. The "SeeClickFix" application is available for all residents to download on any iOS or Android device. On May 2, the City co-hosted a Purple Heart Sign Unveiling and Congressional Gold Medal Award Ceremony along with the Filipino Veterans Recognition and Education Project. This event was memorable as World War II veteran Harvey Drahos, age 101, Lacey, WA, was presented a Congressional Gold Medal. Five other World War II deceased veterans were honored posthumously, with the CGM being presented to their Next of Kins.

Notice is provided of the availability of the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) for the proposed Pioneer Aggregates South Parcel Project.
